Self-Harm Prevention Guidelines for Bandina Christian Youth Camp, Inc.

It is the policy of Bandina Christian Youth Camp to seek good mental health for all campers. If a staff member learns that a camper expresses desire to harm self, that staff member is to immediately consult with the Session Director of the Camp Health Officer (CHO). The following steps should be taken:

- 4. Every effort should be made to not escalate the situation by drawing undue attention to the camper or the problem.
- 5. The Session Director or the CHO will contact the parent or guardian of the camper.
- 6. Questions to answer:
 - An effort should be made to determine if the camper has acted on suicidal thoughts in the past in order to determine the seriousness of the situation.
 - Any item in the camper's possession that might be used to cause harm to self or another should be removed.
 - Is the camper on mood altering medications or has the camper taken medication?
 - Has the camper had a confrontation with another camper?
 - Has camper told others of plans?
 - Has the camper given away items to others?
 - Does the camper have any items on which they could overdose?
- 7. If there are signs of immediate risk for suicide, immediately contact either the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 800-273-TALK or a mental health professional.
- 8. Emergency or mental health professionals should evaluate the camper for proper care.
- 9. The camper should not be returned to the general population, but should be returned to the parent or guardian for further care.
- 10. If the camper population, or the camper's cabin is not aware of the situation, as little as possible should be reported. (e.g. "the camper is not well")
- 11. If the camper population, or the camper's cabin is aware of the situation, the fellow campers should be informed that the camper has been referred for appropriate care for the situation.
