What We Can Learn From Taxes

Aren't you excited every year when April 15th comes around so that you can pay your taxes? Of course, I'm only joking because I have yet to see someone who is excited to pay the government from their hard earned money. The history of income tax in America is interesting. We know about the American Revolution which took place in the 1700's, in part, because of the opposition to British taxes on the colonies. Income taxes were usually implemented in our early years as a country to pay for the expense of war such as the War of 1812 and the Civil War. Then, in 1913, the 16th Amendment to the Constitution made income taxes a permanent fixture in the U.S. Did you know that the highest tax rate from 1944 through the early 1960's was 91% for those who made \$200,000 or more? That's right, 91% of a wealthy persons money went toward taxes in that era! Wow! Things changed drastically in the 1980's when tax rates were cut close to what they are in 2024. Still, most people would probably say that taxes are too high.

Taxes are collected and used for things like national defense, social programs, education, and much more. Some Christians claim they have a right to not pay taxes because lesus would not do so. They say that since some tax revenues go towards things that are "anti-Christian," we have a right in refusing to pay. While we should take advantage of "legal" exemptions, all Christians should pay taxes they owe.

On one occasion, Jesus was asked a question about taxes by the Pharisees and Herodians so that they might trap Him. They asked, "Teacher, we know that You are true, and teach the way of God in truth; nor do You care about anyone, for You do not regard the person of men. ¹⁷ Tell us, therefore, what do You think? Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" (Matthew 22:16-17) They thought they had laid the perfect trap, but He knew their intentions and said to them, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites? ¹⁹ Show Me the tax money.' So they brought Him a denarius. ²⁰ And He said to them, 'Whose image and inscription is this?' ²¹ They said to Him, 'Caesar's.' And He said to them, 'Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's.' 22 When they had heard these words, they marveled, and left Him and went their way." (Matthew 22:18-22) Notice that since money belongs to the government, it is the Christian's obligation to pay was is required. Even though the Roman government was corrupt, Jesus said that taxes must still be paid. Further, Romans 13:5-7

makes is clear that all Christian's must give to the governing authorities what is required. "... You must be subject, not only because of wrath but also for conscience' sake. ⁶ For because of this you also pay taxes, for they are God's ministers attending continually to this very thing. Render therefore to all their due: taxes to whom taxes are due, customs to whom customs, fear to whom fear, honor to whom honor."

Let's take special notice of something Jesus said that may have been overlooked in our consideration of taxes. Jesus said, "Render therefore to Caesar the

things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." We all have obligations we must fulfill to God! We must submit to His will, obey His commands, and worship Him. He expects nothing less from those He created and continually blesses Since the tax season is upon us, be diligent to fulfill your responsibilities to the government. But, don't forget to be even more persistent in giving "to God the things that are God's." He expects your humble and devoted service!
